What is the project?


Home radon screening by community paramedics (partnership with Mobile Medix).

How does it align with the Cancer Plan?

Goal 9: Reduce radon gas exposure in all Florida households, workplaces, and other buildings.

Any updates?

- Identified 3 communities with radon hot spots using FDOH zip data.
- Created survey to target homes with greatest need and enroll the homeowner for paramedic conducted screening.
- Promoting survey during regular community paramedicine visits and online.
- Screenings at many community paramedicine visits but no positive detections.


Website with cancer screening best practices on-demand webinars/lectures for the five leading causes of cancer in Florida as well as screening sites in 7-county Collaborative region.

How does it align with the Cancer Plan?

Education and screening opportunities will encompass 2020-2025 Florida Cancer Plan goals 3 and 10 (tobacco cessation, lung cancer > low-dose CT lung scans), goal 4 (cervical cancer > pap test and HPV), goal 5 (skin cancer > dermatology exams), goal 11 (breast cancer > mammography), goal 12 (colorectal > colonoscopies), and goal 13 (prostate > PSA and DRE).

Any updates?

Web site fully functional (English/Spanish) and marketing materials developed. Two of the 7 proposed sites have adopted the tool for their clients. Project ends 1/31/2024.



ECFCCC CIG UPDATE (PROPOSED PROJECT)

What is the project?

Big Colon/Small Town educational experience.

Using CIG funds, the NCFCCC purchased the Big Colon/Small Town experience. In 2025, the ECFCCC proposes that it will partner with the NCFCCC to implement this educational experience at least five (5) times in 2025 in the ECFCC region. We hope to piggyback this experience with other cancer screening and education opportunities. In addition, we are determining if it will be feasible to distribute FREE FIT tests as well.

How does it align with the Cancer Plan?

Education and screening opportunities will encompass 2020-2025 Florida Cancer Plan goals 3 and 10 (tobacco cessation, lung cancer > low-dose CT lung scans), goal 4 (cervical cancer > pap test and HPV), goal 5 (skin cancer > dermatology exams), goal 11 (breast cancer > mammography), goal 12 (colorectal > colonoscopies), and goal 13 (prostate > PSA and DRE).


The ECFCCC is currently planning for a potential scholarship program for community health workers (CHW) in the region to receive Tobacco Treatment Specialist (TTS) certification and/or some sort of brief intervention training to provide more education to CHWs to assist their clients with tobacco issues.

During 2024, the ECFCCC conducted virtual webinars of ovarian cancer survivorship resources as well as lung cancer best practices screenings (lung cancer screening best practices provided by Moffitt).
