

SMALL TOWN GIANT COLON EXPERIENCE AND COMMUNITY EDUCATION OFFERINGS 2024-2025

Community Education – utilize giant inflatable colon

- Bringing the Inflatable Colon to workplaces with target populations of uninsured, minority, and transportation disadvantaged.
- Sustaining and increasing collaborative partnerships to assist with the planning and implementation of health events to raise awareness of cancer screenings as well as providing tours of the giant inflatable colon.
- Providing more FIT screens and clinic referral opportunities at small-town giant colon.

What is the project?

Big Colon/Small Town educational experience.

Using CIG funds, the NCFCCC purchased the Big Colon/Small Town experience.
