Direct Appropriations - Florida Cancer Collaborative Innovation Fund (FCCIF)


\$20 million is designated for cancer research funding with the potential of recurring funding pending annual appropriation.






King Applications and Funded Projects







Did the Biomedical Research Grant funding help support you receiving tenure or promotion?




Feedback on Biomedical Research Grant Program Impact on Researchers' Careers

- ✓ Allowed continuation of research during loss of NIH funding
- Tested new anticancer drug which was patented and distributed to other researchers
- ✓ Helped me to establish a research program in Epigenetics
- ✓ Florida Biomedical Research Grant Program funding enabled me to test an idea that blood vessels are a sanctuary site for cancer, which led to the development of new cancer treatments translated into clinical treatments for cancer patients
- ✓ The funding by FDOH led to multiple publications, patents, and additional funding from NIH. Several compounds discovered as a result of FDOH funding are in pre-clinical trials showing promise for further development



Success Stories

- This state funding kept me in the State of Florida and enabled me to invent new treatments for cancer patients in Florida. Florida is gravely underfunding this program compared to Texas and other large states that are serious about investing in their research workforce. The Biomedical Medical Research Program needs 5X more funding
- This funding resulted in a novel cancer therapy that is currently in clinical trials, with the technology acquired by a multi-national Pharma company
- Our early work in minimally invasive staging of lung cancer has now transformed the field from surgical (mediastinoscopy) to endoscopic (endobronchial FNA), as well as led to related advances in early pancreas cancer detection
- The technician working on the project went to medical school and is now a resident of radiology. His
 father, a citizen of Palm Beach, came to my office and told me that research had transformed his son's
 life



The Florida Cancer Centers of Excellence Re-Designation

Application cycle for re-designation continues through October 13th.

Re-Designation is required for:

- Mayo Clinic Jacksonville
- Moffitt Cancer Center
- UM Sylvester Cancer Center
- UF Health Cancer Center (includes UF Shands Hospital, UF Health Proton Therapy Institute and Orlando Health's Orlando Regional Medical Center)

Joint Committee will be needed in November (BRAC and CCRAB)

Joint Committee for the Florida Cancer Centers of Excellence Program

The Joint Committee, consisting of 13 members (7 from CCRAB, 6 from BRAC) is required to:

- Develop rigorous performance measures, a rating system, and a rating standard that must be achieved to document and distinguish a cancer center that excels in providing quality, comprehensive, and patient-centered coordinated care.
- Review at least every 3 years and revise, if applicable, the performance measures, rating system, and rating standard to ensure providers are continually enhancing their programs to reflect best practices and advances in cancer treatment and care from the perspective of quality, comprehensive, and patient-centered coordinated care.

Performance Measures and Rating System:

The Florida Cancer Control and Research Advisory Council and the Biomedical Research Advisory Council will review and approve prior to the evaluation of any provider under such criteria.
