




Cancer Incidence




Cancer Case Count by Population





Lung Cancer Screening – Florida Cancer Plan

Goal 10: Reduce lung cancer mortality through early detection of lung cancers in Floridians.

- Within the population of Floridians newly diagnosed with lung cancer, increase the percentage of those with limited stage disease (Stage 1 and 2).
- □ Identify or develop a surveillance method that measures the percentage of Florida adults aged 50-80 years old who are at higher risk for lung cancer and who have undergone annual lung cancer screenings.



Lung Cancer Screening with Low Dose CT

The only recommended screening test for lung cancer is low-dose computed tomography (also called a low-dose CT scan). Screening is recommended only for adults who have no symptoms but are at high risk.


Eligibility


- Adults aged 50 to 80 years who have a 20 pack-year smoking history and currently smoke or have quit within the past 15 years
- Screening should be discontinued once a person has not smoked for 15 years or develops a health problem that substantially limits life expectancy or the ability or willingness to have curative lung surgery.

Among those eligible for LDCT screening:

- > 5% 6% are screened nationally
- > 3% are screened in Florida

Estimated proportion of adults aged 55-80 years eligible for lung cancer screening with low-dose computed tomography (Low Dose CT)...











Proportion eligible adults aged 55-80 years screened for lung cancer in the past year with low-dose CT.






Cancer Incidence Rates in Florida versus the US
