

Disparities Report

Age-adjusted Cervical Cancer Incidence, Rate Per 100,000 Female Population, Single Year - 2018



The 2018 incidence rate for cervical cancer in Florida and the Southwest Florida region is the highest among the Black and African American community. Overall, the incidence rate for the Black and AA community in 2018 was 11.4, with the rate for the White community at 8.3, and the rate for the Hispanic Community at 7.8. Hendry and Highlands counties have the highest incidence rate for cervical cancer for the Black community in the Southwest region, with Polk and Hernando counties following behind.

SWFCCC will be relaunching the Tobacco workgroup with the help of our members from CivCom to address lung cancer mortality. This action is in line with the Florida Cancer Plan's goals 3 and 10.
